

Redbridge is a mixed comprehensive school for pupils aged 11-16. It is one of the best-equipped schools in the region and is now one of the most popular schools in Southampton.

The school is consistently commended for its high standards of achievement. We have recently been recognised by HM Chief Inspector of Schools as a particularly successful school. We are ranked as one of the top performing schools in the country for value added pupil progress.

Redbridge has a rapidly rising roll. The school is heavily oversubscribed with admission requests far exceeding available places.

A CURRICULUM FOR THE 21ST CENTURY

Everyone at Redbridge is committed to a curriculum which provides opportunities for individual success.

We have an innovative curriculum with a wide range of resources which include:

- Outstanding Sports facilities, both indoor and outdoor.
- Superb Music Technology and Recording facilities.
- Specialist Technology and Science suites.
- A modern, well-stocked Library and excellent Learning Centre.
- Specialist Dance and Drama Studios with cutting edge sound and lighting systems.
- Six specialist ICT suites and computer access in every classroom.
- A Public Performance Area equipped with a sound and lighting gallery.
- First class Technology and Science suites.
- A Hearing Impaired Resource.

PROGRAMMES OF STUDY

All pupils in Year 7 follow a skills-based curriculum called Opening Minds.

Opening Minds teaches our pupils vital skills which will prepare them fully for their future school life and beyond. The key areas of this curriculum are:

- Learning
- Citizenship
- Relating to People
- Managing Situations
- Managing Information

Opening Minds incorporates all National Curriculum subjects but focuses especially on Art, Drama, Music, History, Geography, RE, PSHE and Citizenship.

The rest of the National Curriculum is taught as separate subjects: English, Maths, Science, ICT, French, PE and Design Technology.

Opening Minds provides the opportunity for pupils to make connections between subject areas and to link their learning.

Pupils in Years 8 and 9 follow the full range of National Curriculum subjects:

In Years 10 and 11 the school offers an extensive range of GCSE and other examinations.

We provide a wide range of National Curriculum subjects including vocational courses. Pupils have the opportunity to take Vocational GCSEs in Science, ICT, Leisure and Tourism and Business Studies.

Key Skill qualifications and Career Planning Certificates are also on offer.

We have strong links with local colleges. Pupils also have opportunities to study NVQs and to study for other Work Related qualifications.

Many courses which are begun in school can be continued at college. For example, NVQs, Key Skills and AS Levels can be continued in our partner colleges.

Our curriculum and qualifications are under constant review so we can equip our young people with the skills required for an ever changing employment market.

SUPPORTING OUR PUPILS TO BECOME EVEN MORE SUCCESSFUL

We recognise and promote the abilities that exist in all our pupils.

All staff are aware of the range of individual talents and use Target Setting Days to celebrate and develop these abilities.

In addition to this we have an extensive Mentoring Programme designed to give pupils a greater understanding of what they have to do to make progress.

Employees from local industry are also involved in the Mentoring Programme for senior pupils.

When we find that pupils have specific talents we offer a wide range of extra courses, special events and projects to support them in achieving their potential.

THE FUTURE

We encourage our pupils to think about their future.

We begin by raising aspirations in Year 7 through Citizenship lessons and mentoring.

Careers Education begins fully in Year 9 when pupils are introduced to the ConneXions Steps Programme. They also have an Options Open Evening when pupils and parents can receive advice and guidance about upper school courses.

In years 10 and 11 pupils experience a whole range of career focused events and activities:

- Industry Days
- World of Work Days
- College Visits
- Business and Industry experiences
- Career Planning Days
- Work Experience

The school employs a ConneXions Personal Advisor who works alongside the Careers Advisor to provide support and guidance.

Many of our pupils take part in extra curricular coaching sessions and taster days at Southampton University or other higher education institutions.

Redbridge is the only secondary school in Southampton to offer Hearing Impaired pupils an inclusive education, working alongside their peers in a mainstream setting. Pupils receive daily support from a qualified and experienced specialist team.

OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS LEARNING

Redbridge is a community school and is dedicated to enriching the lives of those living within the community and beyond.

The school is open from 8am to 10pm almost every day of the year.

A Breakfast Club operates and pupils have opportunities to attend a variety of classes at the end of the school day.

There are currently over 25 sporting activities on offer as well as a huge range of clubs and activities. These include:

As a Sports College we regularly enter and achieve success in competitions at local and national level in both team and individual events.

From the start of their secondary school career pupils are encouraged to take increased responsibility for their own learning.


We place a high value on personal appearance and set clear uniform requirements.
