

## How to use an image as a link

You're probably familiar with using the hyperlink button  to make a link, but did you know you can use an image as well as text for the link? This guide shows you how to upload an image and use it as a link.

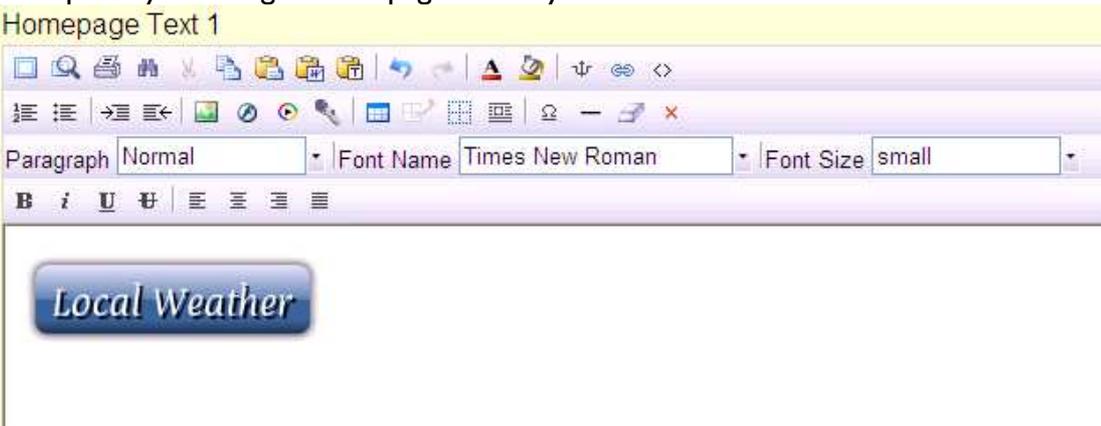
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### Upload your image onto the page you want to link from

1. First choose the image that will be your link.

<p>You might make a button (perhaps using <a href="http://cooltext.com">http://cooltext.com</a>)...</p>	
<p>... or you could use a picture of the page you're going to.</p> <p>Remember to resize the image to keep the file small</p>	

2. Upload your image to the page where you want to use it:



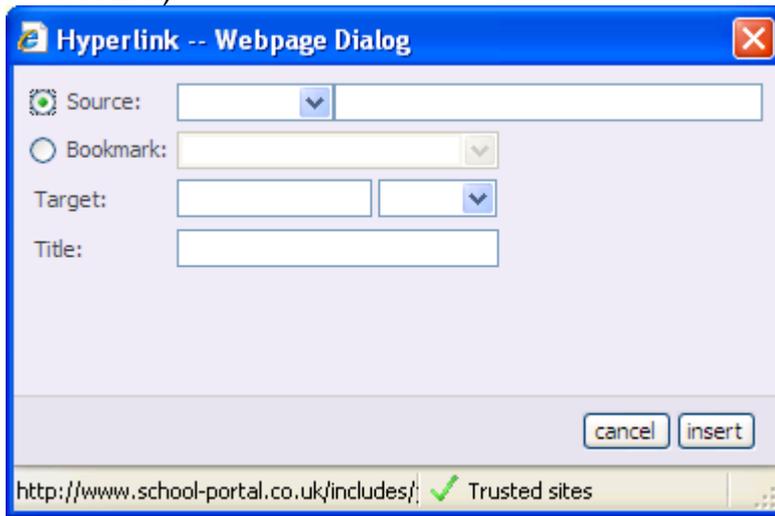

## Make your image into a hyperlink

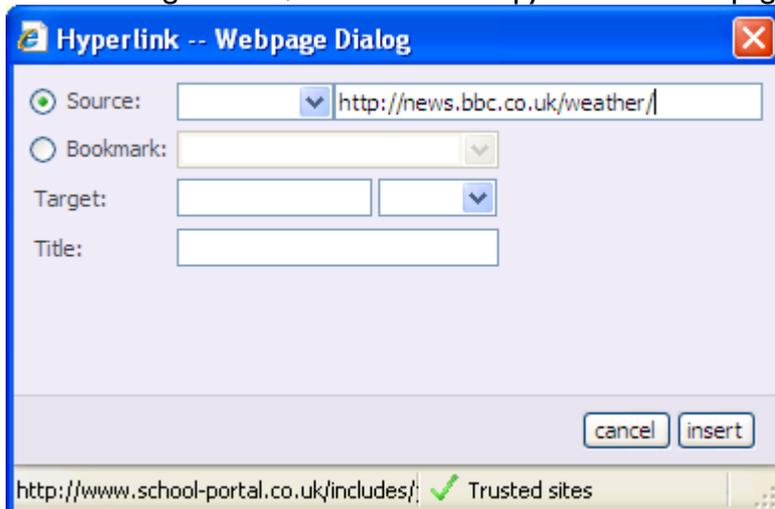
3. Click the image to select it. You should see a box at each corner:



4. Click the hyperlink button to open the hyperlink dialog (or you can press CTRL-K):



5. Enter the address of the page you want to open in the second source box. If it's a long address, it's easiest to copy this from the page you are visiting.



6. Click 'Insert'. The 'http://' part of the address should move into the first source box:



7. Now click OK and the link will be on your page. Save the page and test the link.



### ***A note on opening new browser windows***

If you wanted the link to open in a new window, you could choose Target:Blank in the Hyperlink dialog. However, this takes control away from the user and could be confusing as clicking 'back' would not return the user to the original page.
