


Sheet County Primary School

We are a small 4-11 village primary school on the outskirts of Petersfield in Hampshire. We are part of a caring and supportive village community, and the ethos of the school reflects this family atmosphere.

The school was founded in 1888 in another part of the village, but was established here in the present building 10 years later. We celebrated this event in 1998. Shortly after that, we received funding for major redevelopment of the site and in 2000 we moved into a beautiful new school building, which has retained the feel of the old! We have an attractive outdoor environment that the children are encouraged to care for, and which is under continuous development.




Our Ethos and Values:
