

NO BULLYING

At Ayios Nikolaos we have a zero tolerance to bullying.

We expect children to:

- ***Display self discipline and have a proper regard for authority and rules***
- ***Behave well and have respect for other children's property and equipment***
- ***Realise and understand what is acceptable and unacceptable behaviour***

All the children know that if they are being bullied they must tell someone straight away. Bullying is taken very seriously and is acted on immediately.

If your child reports that they are being bullied at school, please let us know straight away. We will monitor the situation very carefully and keep you informed.

All incidents of inappropriate behaviour are recorded and parents of both children are always informed about the incident and the action that has been taken.

A BEHAVIOUR GUIDE FOR PARENTS

GOOD TO BE GREEN

Ayios Nikolaos
Primary School



'The Ayios Nikolaos Primary School way' is that there are high expectations of the children in terms of behaviour to ensure that all children work to the best of their ability.

At Ayios Nikolaos we follow a positive behaviour system called 'Good to be green'

Each class has a wallet with all the names of the children in it, along with their own set of behaviour cards. The wallet acts as a visual reminder for the children and each class has a wallet monitor so that it can go with them when they have PE or are taking part in Spiritual Arts

Green – good to be green – everybody begins each learning session on 'good to be green'

Amber – a warning card – the children are then expected to make the right behaviour choices so that they can get back to being 'good to be green'

Red – a consequence card which is usually loss of golden time (3 minutes in FS and KS1 and 5 minutes in KS2)

When children lose golden time this is recorded and this lost time is spent with the Headteacher. Parents are informed if a child loses three lots of golden time within a half term.

Children who are always 'good to be green' are rewarded through stickers and badges. There are also further rewards that vary slightly depending on the age of the children where the children gain a class reward. In autumn 2015, we will be setting up a Good to be green shop which will be based in the library.

GOLDEN RULES

These are our agreed set of rules at the beginning of the school year. They are reviewed regularly and these rules are known as the Golden Rules. They will be followed by all classes from FS2-Yr6. FS1 have a 'Good Guys Guide'

Children are expected to follow our golden rules. At the end of the week they are then able to take part in half an hour of golden time.

Golden time is a celebration of the positive behaviour demonstrated throughout the week. Each half term, a child will sign up for an activity run by a member of staff.

Our Golden rules are:

We are gentle

We are kind and helpful

We listen

We are honest

We work hard

We look after property



HOUSE POINTS

- Each child will belong to a house (Kyrenia Reds, Paphos Yellows, Troodos Greens and Famagusta Blues). House points can be awarded throughout the week for achievement, behaviour, for work of a high standard, for effort and attitude to work or for a sporting or team event.
- Each time a child achieves 50 house points, a certificate will be awarded in the Friday celebration assembly and a sticker is also put into the children's individual learning files. The child in each class with the most house points at the end of each term will receive a certificate and a badge to keep, and a class trophy cup to hold for the forthcoming term. Children, who receive the cup three times, will be awarded a special shield.
- The children work in their teams, with the team who has received the most house points each week receiving a large rosette to hang on their 'washing line'. At the end of each term the winning team will be congratulated and will have their coloured ribbons placed on the school cup.
