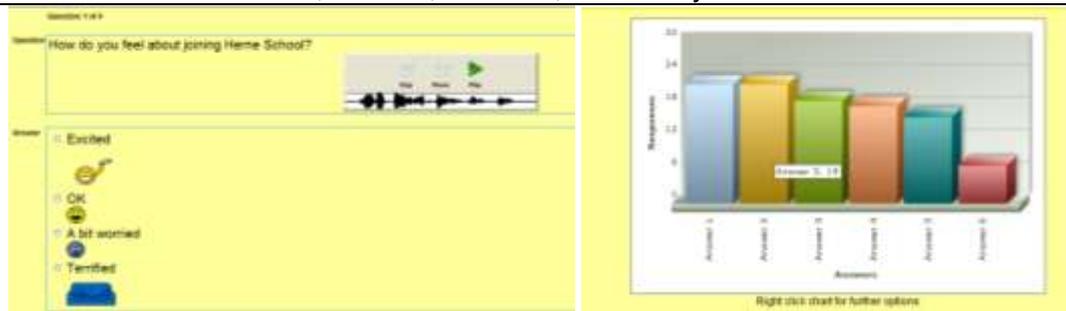

A Response to Your Questions

Hi Claire, It's Lucy, can you read this and tell me if you like it?

Princess Claire was the most beautiful girl in the land. Everyone really, really liked her. Well, everyone except from two certain creatures... These horrible Baddies were, Diddly the Cat and Nipper the Rabbit. They wanted to hurt Princess Claire so that they could take over the land! But of course, Claire's great friends, Super Hibble and Super Baul wouldn't let them! They were such fantastic Super Animals and they always saved her! Anyway, Diddly and Nipper were making a horrible plan. So one day these terrible baddies were creeping up to Princess Claire's castle... Thanks for reading this, I hope you like it so far!

How this worked in practice: Sue Bowden, year 2 teacher at Whitehill Infant School and Chris Richards year 5 teacher at Herne Junior School, worked together to use the learning platform to support transition between the schools. A buddy system between year 2 and year 5 already existed and the use of the learning platform would complement this. An area was set up on Herne Junior's Learning platform and access was given to the year 2 children from Whitehill.

A  survey was set up to find out how the year 2 children felt about moving on to the juniors. These screenshots show an example question from the  survey. The questions used text, images as well as embedded sound recordings, and was accessible to all the year 2 children. Once all the year 2 children had completed the survey the year 5 buddies analysed the responses. This is very straightforward, as the results from the  survey can be published automatically and are displayed as graphs. This graph shows most children are worried about being with older children and not understanding the work. Therefore, the year 5 children then contributed to a  wiki aimed at giving information to the year 2's based on the things they were worried about. In addition to the  wiki. The year 5's also used  forum to tell stories to their buddies and asked for feedback.

By the end of this sequence of work children had developed skills in:

Learning: Self-Review, Independent Learning

PSHE: Transition, Making Friends

Next Steps: To develop ePortfolio homepages, perhaps using the UniServity My Million Words project, for the buddies to introduce themselves to their new transition-friends.
